

Ports in the Caribbean Coast

Puerto Limon, the Caribbean's main port of call, awaits visitors with its exuberant vegetation and friendly Afro-Caribbean culture.

Once you arrive in Limon, you will find many options for enjoying your visit. In the Northern Caribbean region you can be in closer contact with nature while visiting the Tortuguero National Park. This zone offers bird watching, turtle watching, sailing along the canals, and a wide variety of flora that completes this tour.

The Southern Caribbean region has beautiful beaches. Cahuita, Puerto Viejo, and Gandoca Manzanillo are the villages that best represent the Caribbean culture, which is shown in their architecture and cuisine.

All this scenic beauty is complemented by an excellent tour menu that offers a great variety of options for visitors: Horseback tours, nature observation, the Tortuguero canals, visits to pineapple plantations, tropical flower plantations, sugar haciendas or banana plantations and even a city tour.

Puerto Limon has a privileged location in the Caribbean coast, due to its proximity to the Panama Canal, Gulf of Mexico, and Southern United States. 160 kms from San Jose, this port is run by JAPDEVA (Port Authorities for the Atlantic Region). Located at 9°, 59' , 30" North Latitude, and 83°, 01' , 48" West Latitude.

The cruise terminal and the roll-on/roll-off facility were built in 1997, and modernized in 2003, to meet the requirements for passenger ships. It is 10 m deep, 295 m long, and 16 m wide, and it also has a tourist terminal. The port complex offers all the necessary services to ensure appropriate operation, such as drinking water, fuel, pilotage, medical services, and others.

Distinguished cruise companies, such as Carnival, Royal Caribbean, Norwegian, Premier Holland America, and many others visit Puerto Limon during cruise season that runs from October through May.

The Port of Moin is 8.2 kms west of Limon. It is located at 10° 00' North Latitude and 83° 05' West Latitude. The Limon-Moin port complex is one of Central America's main port facilities. It is the commercial gateway to the United States, Latin America, and Europe.

Ports in the Pacific Coast

Puntarenas and Caldera are the two main ports in the Costa Rican Pacific coast. These two ports are run by INCOP (Port Authority for the Pacific Region).

Leaving from Puntarenas or Caldera, you will be less than 2 hours away from the many exciting tours in the zone: National Parks in the Mid-Pacific region, like Manuel Antonio and Carara. In the Central Valley, you will be able to enjoy the imposing beauty of the Poas Volcano and Sarchi, well known for its locally made beautiful hand crafts, or you can also go to San Jose, the capital city, approximately 2 hours away from Puntarenas.

The Mid-Pacific region has numerous interesting options like: Horseback tours, alligator watching, aerial trams, white water rafting, and hiking across the bridges suspended in the treetops.

Only the cruise ships whose final destination is Costa Rica are currently arriving in Puerto Caldera, whose passengers then fly back to their country, or they sometimes choose to visit the country for a few more days. This port has a marginal wharf with a 490 m-long docking area.

The port of Puntarenas is located at 9°, 58' North latitude. It has a jetty divided in two sections: the first one starts at the seaside, with a 207 m-long access bridge. The second one is a docking platform with fenders on both sides and mooring bollards. A 16 x 8 cluster of docks and mooring piles, and an 8 x 8 m cluster of mooring piles connected by two zinc-coated steel bridges. It also has two 265 m-long docking areas, with a 14 m-wide floor. The average depth is 10.5 m and the ocean current is two knots. The port also has ducts and pipelines for a good supply of drinking water, fuel, power supply and telephone lines, plus all the necessary services to suit large cruise companies, such as: Carnival, Princess Cruises, Crystal, and Norwegian among others.
